### New-Look Fighting Scots to Face Four Ranked Teams in Southern Scuffle

**EDINBORO, PA** -- Edinboro head coach Tim Flynn has always believed in facing a difficult schedule. With that in mind, there is very little Christmas break for the Fighting Scots, as they head to Greensboro, NC to participate in the Southern Scuffle. Hosted by the University of North Carolina Greensboro, the Southern Scuffle will be held in the Greensboro Coliseum's Special Events Center on Monday, December 29 and Tuesday, December 30.

All told, five nationally-ranked teams according to the latest USA Today/InterMat/NWCA Division I Top 25 will compete, highlighted by Cornell, tied for third. Edinboro is ranked 17th, with Hofstra ranked 19th, Old Dominion 21st, and Virginia 23rd. A total of 28 teams will compete in the 2008 Southern Scuffle.

More than that, there are numerous ranked wrestlers in each weight class, although possibly the most anticipated match does not appear it will take place. Edinboro's Gregor Gillespie, ranked number one at 157 lbs. by InterMat and the 149 lb. champion in 2007, is the number one seed. Cornell's Jordan Leen, who won the 157 lb. national title a year ago, defeating Gillespie 8-6 in the semifinals, is currently ranked fourth but is not listed among the seeds and apparently won't compete. In all, 41 of InterMat's ranked grapplers are scheduled to compete.

Edinboro comes off a strong showing in the Reno Tournament prior to Christmas. The Fighting Scots finished second out of 30 teams, with Oklahoma State winning the title. Eight Fighting Scots placed, with three bringing home championships.

The Edinboro lineup will feature eight wrestlers ranked either by InterMat, Amateur Wrestling News or WIN Magazine. Tim Flynn's contingent of 15 wrestlers will also include two newcomers who will make their Edinboro debuts.

# 2008-09 Edinboro Wrestling

Paul Donahoe is a transfer from Nebraska who has competed as an unattached wrestler at a trio of open tournaments at 125 lbs. and has a 12-0 record. The two-time All-American gives Edinboro two former national champions in its lineup, as the senior won the 125 lb. crown in 2007. He finished third a year ago.

In addition, Stephen Waite has just transferred from West Virginia and is eligible to compete immediately. A sophomore, the former Fort LeBoeuf High School standout won the 135 lb. PIAA Class AA state title as a senior. He was 5-7 while competing at 141 lbs. for the Mountaineers last year.

After Gillespie, the next highest-ranked Fighting Scot is Jarrod King, who is ranked sixth at 165 lbs. Joey Fendone (8th at heavyweight) and Chris Honeycutt (10th at 184 lbs.) are also in the top ten.

A year ago Edinboro finished second to Minnesota in the Southern Scuffle with 30 teams competing. Gillespie finished second, with King and Honeycutt placing third. In fact, it was the coming out party for Honeycutt, a true freshman who was the backup at the time. He went on to earn a trip to Nationals. Joey Fendone was fourth as eight Fighting Scots placed.

## ► Head Coach

### Tim Flynn, Edinboro

Now in his 12th season at the helm of the Fighting Scots, Tim Flynn has enjoyed incredible success. He has a 127-37-3 record in dual matches, eight wins shy of the career record for wins. More importantly, he has led Edinboro to 10 EWL Tournament championships in the last 11 years and 10 PSAC titles in 12 years. Edinboro has finished in the top ten at the NCAA Division I National Championships two of the last three years.

## ► The Edinboro Lineup

### ► 125 lbs. – Paul Donahoe (12-0, Sr.)/Kyle Fluke (13-8, Jr.)

Donahoe will make his official debut as a Fighting Scot after competing in three open tournaments as an unattached wrestler during the first semester. The senior is a two-time All-American after transferring to Edinboro from Nebraska this summer. He cleared NCAA transfer rules recently and should prove a huge addition to the Boro lineup, even with Fluke's recent strong wrestling. Donahoe is currently 12-0 with titles at the UB Open, Michigan State Open and Mat Town Tournament, and has a 98-18 career record. His victories include a 4-1 decision over third-ranked Brandon Precin of Northwestern in the title match of the Michigan State Open. Donahoe finished third at Nationals a year ago after winning the 125 lb. national championship in 2007. Fluke is in his first season as the starter at 125 lbs. after competing a year ago at 133 lbs. Fluke brings a record of 13-8 into the Southern Scuffle after finishing third at the Reno Tournament. He went 5-1 in Reno, including a 5-4 decision over 12th-ranked Marcus Orozco of UC Davis in the consolation final. That was his second upset of a ranked wrestler in less than a week after handing a 16th-ranked Nikko Triggas of Ohio State a 6-2 loss. The week before Fluke suffered a 6-4 sudden victory loss to Clarion's Jay Ivanco in the finals of the PSAC Championships. He reached the finals when he pinned 20th-ranked Ian Moser of Bloomsburg in 30 seconds. Fluke placed fourth at the Oklahoma Gold Classic. Donahoe will debut as the number one seed. His greatest competition figures to come from 10th-ranked Jarrod Garnett of Virginia Tech and 12th-ranked Brandon Zoetewey of Cal State Bakersfield.

### ► 133 lbs. – Ricky Deubel (11-8, Sr.)/Aaron Ely (Fr-r)

A two-time national qualifier, Deubel has been up-and-down this year, but comes off his best showing of the year with a second place finish at the Reno Tournament. Deubel went 4-1 to boost his record to 11-8 and give him an 89-46 career record. In the semifinals, he upset 19th-ranked Thomas Kimbrell of Cal State Bakersfield, 6-2, before suffering a 4-1 loss to 17th-ranked T.J. Dillashaw of Cal State Fullerton in the finals. Prior to that he suffered a 14-6 loss to eighth-ranked Reece Humphrey of Ohio State. Deubel posted a second place finish at the PSAC Championships, falling 2-1 in a tiebreaker to Kutztown's Joe Kemmerer. Ely will also represent the Fighting Scots. He is just 2-2, but his wins include a 3-0 decision over Pittsburgh's Brad Gentzle. Three ranked wrestlers are in the field, led by seventh-ranked Joe Baker of Navy. In addition, Lou Ruggirello of Hofstra is 10th and Kent State's Dan Mitcheff is 12th.

### ► 141 lbs. – Joel Webster (12-5, Jr.)/Stephen Waite (0-0, So.)

Webster continues to be one of the biggest surprises for the Fighting Scots. The junior did not compete a year ago, joined the team late during preseason drills, then proceeded to win the 141 lb. weight class at wrestleoffs. He has a 12-5 record after finishing sixth at the Reno Tournament. He dropped the fifth place match to 18th-ranked Vincent Ramirez of North Carolina by a 9-0 major decision. Webster started the month winning the PSAC title, captur-

ing a 6-1 decision over A.J. Milanak of Gannon in the finals. He followed that up with the biggest win of his career, a 5-4 decision over defending national champion J Jagers of Ohio State. Jagers is a two-time All-American and came in ranked eighth. Webster was not intimidated, registering the winning takedown with 12 seconds left, then holding off Jagers' escape attempt. For his efforts Webster was named the EWL and PSAC Wrestler of the Week. Waite transferred from West Virginia last week and is eligible immediately since he did not compete this fall. He went 5-7 for the Mountaineers, including a 10-2 major decision over Torsten Gillespie. Waite was thrown into the starting lineup after a season-ending injury to Brandon Rader. He finished third at the EWL Tournament. Waite is well-known locally after winning the 135 lb. PIAA Class AA state championship as a senior at Fort LeBoeuf High School. The 8-6 win over Colby Pisani of Ridgway capped a 38-4 season. Chris Diaz of Virginia Tech is the lone ranked competitor in the field, coming in 11th.

## ► **149 lbs. – #15 Torsten Gillespie (15-6, So.)**

Gillespie has a 15-6 record after placing sixth at the Reno Tournament. The sophomore was actually in line for a higher finish after reaching the semifinals, where dropped a 2-1 decision to fifth-ranked Bryce Saddoris of Navy. He did not compete in the consolation semifinals or fifth place place due to illness, losing by medical forfeit. The week before Gillespie suffered a 7-1 loss to fourth-ranked Lance Palmer of Ohio State. Prior to that he rallied for a last-second win in the PSAC Championships. He posted a reversal with one second remaining for a 9-8 win over Bloomsburg's George Hickman in the finals. Gillespie also has a fifth place finish at the Oklahoma Gold Classic to his credit. He was a national qualifier a year ago. Third-ranked Darrion Caldwell of North Carolina State is the top wrestler in the field. Saddoris is ranked fifth and Pete Yates of Virginia Tech is 20th.

## ► **157 lbs. – #1 Gregor Gillespie (18-0, Sr.)**

Gillespie remained perfect at 18-0 with four wins in the Reno Tournament to capture first place. He won twice by technical fall to give him seven for the year, then posted an 11-0 major decision over Oklahoma State's Neil Erisman in the finals. He recently picked up a 6-2 decision over Ohio State's Jason Johnstone, who came in ranked 15th. Gillespie has moved into first place in the InterMat rankings, although he is ranked second by Amateur Wrestling News and fourth by WIN Magazine. Gillespie has boosted his career ledger to 129-10, moving past Tony Robie and Josh Koscheck into sixth place in career wins. He is a three-time All-American, finishing seventh as a freshman at 149 lbs., winning the national title as a sophomore at the same weight, then moving up to 157 lbs. last year and placing fifth. He was named the Outstanding Wrestler at the PSAC Championships for the second straight year. He also has a first place showing at the Oklahoma Gold Classic to his credit. While a Gillespie-Leen matchup likely won't happen, Gillespie could face an old and familiar foe in Bloomsburg's Mike Moley, who is ranked ninth. The two met in the PSAC finals, with Gillespie prevailing, 3-0. Jedd Moore of Virginia is ranked 20th.

## ► **165 lbs. – #6 Jarrod King (16-1, Sr.)/Chris Hrunka (3-2, Fr.-r)**

After suffering his first loss of the year, a 4-1 decision to thitrd-ranked Clint Sponseller of Ohio State, King came back with a dominant showing at the Reno Tournament after falling from third to sixth in the latest InterMat rankings. He won twice by fall and picked up a technical fall before defeating 12th-ranked Brandon Mason of Oklahoma State, 6-2. That boosted his record to 16-1. King is a

senior who recently won the PSAC title for the second straight year. He was also first at the Oklahoma Gold Classic, upsetting then sixth-ranked Trevor Stewart of Central Michigan, 4-2. Sophomore Chris Hrunka is also in Edinboro's lineup. Top-ranked Mack Lewnes of Cornell has to be considered the favorite, with Keegan Mueller of North Carolina ranked 19th and Ryan Patrovich of Hofstra ranked 20th.

## ► **174 lbs. – Paul Paddock (5-8, Fr.-r)**

Paddock is filling in for injured starter Phil Moricone, who has not competed since the Fighting Scot Duals. Moricone is a two-time national qualifier. Paddock is a former blue-chip recruit who redshirted a year ago. He got off to a tough start, losing his first four matches before coming back with three straight wins, all by fall, at last week's PSAC Championships. Paddock is 5-8 after going 2-2 at the Reno Tournament. He won his first two matches before losing to 15th-ranked Austin Trotman of Appalachian State, 3-1, in the quarterfinals. He then was eliminated via an 8-6 loss to Nick Purdue of Ohio. He previously finished fourth at the PSAC's. Paddock faces a tall challenge in the Southern Scuffle, with seven ranked wrestlers expected to compete. Leading the way is Steve Anceravage of Cornell, ranked fifth, along with seventh-ranked Alton Lucas Of Hofstra and Chris Henrich of Virginia (11th), Luke Rebertus of Navy (16th), Trotman (18th), Jacob Ison of Ohio (19th), and Boston University's Hunter Meys (20th).

## ► **184 lbs. – #10 Chris Honeycutt (13-2, So.)/Shawn Fendone (3-1, So.)**

Honeycutt was named the EWL and PSAC Wrestler of the Week after capturing first place at the Reno Tournament. The sophomore knocked off a pair of ranked wrestlers while winning all five of his matches. That boosted his season record to 13-2. Three wins put him in the semifinals against 19th-ranked John Barone of Duke, with Honeycutt prevailing, by major decision, 12-2. In the finals he met tenth-ranked Joe LeBlanc of Wyoming, the number one seed, and came away with a 4-1 decision. Honeycutt is now ranked tenth by InterMat, but is as high as sixth by WIN Magazine. Prior to that Honeycutt suffered an 8-1 loss to defending national champion Mike Pucillo of Ohio State. Pucillo came in ranked number one. Honeycutt's other loss is a 7-2 decision to Kirk Smith of Boise State, who is now ranked fourth. Fendone will also compete at 184 lbs. for the Fighting Scots. He has a 3-1 record, bringing home second place in the Oklahoma Gold Classic, losing to Dustin Kilgore of Kent State, who is currently ranked sixth, in the finals. In addition to Honeycutt, the 184 lb. field features four ranked wrestlers in sixth-ranked Kilgore, 14th-ranked Josh Patterson of Binghamton, 17th-ranked Justin Keeber of Cornell, and 18th-ranked Chris Daggett of Liberty.

## ► **197 lbs. – #20 Pat Bradshaw (16-4, Jr.)**

Bradshaw was turning in a strong showing at the Reno Tournament before going down with an injury and medical forfeiting the third place match. His lone loss was to Stanford's Luke Feist in the quarterfinals, but he came back to three straight bouts in the wrestlebacks. It is possible that Bradshaw will not be able to compete in the Southern Scuffle. A year ago Bradshaw joined his father Jeff, a former Fighting Scot, as a PSAC champion. Now they can say they both won two titles after Pat came away with his second title recently. He followed that up with a 3-0 decision over Ohio State's Cody Gardner prior to the Reno Tournament. Bradshaw is ranked 20th by InterMat. He also placed third at the Oklahoma Gold Classic. Cayle Byers of George Mason is the highest-ranked wrestlers at sixth, followed by Hofstra's Joe Fagianio (14th), 16th-ranked Brandon Halsey of Cal State- Bakersfield, and 17th-ranked Cam Simaz of Cornell.

► **Hwt. – #8 Joey Fendone (14-1, Sr.)** Fendone is a three-time national qualifier with an 89-33 career record. He did not compete in the Reno Tournament. Ranked eighth, he suffered his first loss of the season against Ohio State's 14th-ranked Corey Morrison by a 5-3 decision, and is now 14-1. He recently won all four of his matches by fall at the PSAC Championships. In addition, Fendone upset then sixth-ranked Jermail Porter of Kent State, 2-0, to win the Oklahoma Gold Classic. Nine of his wins have come by fall, giving him 34 for his career. Fendone will face a very loaded field with six ranked wrestlers in addition to Fendone. The field includes seventh-ranked Mitch Montiero of Cal State-Bakersfield, ninth-ranked Jermail Porter of Kent State, plus Zach Hammond of Cornell (10th), Duke's Konrad Dudziak (11th), Scott Steele of Navy (12th), and Justin Dobies of North Carolina (20th).

## Plaid Talk

### ► Stephen Waite Joins Fighting Scots

Former PIAA champion **Stephen Waite** has transferred to Edinboro from West Virginia. Since he did not compete for the Mountaineers this fall, Waite is eligible immediately and will make his Fighting Scot debut in the Southern Scuffle. Waite competed at 141 lbs. a year ago and was inserted into WVU's starting lineup as a true freshman when Brandon Rader went down with a season-ending injury. He finished with a 5-7 record and placed third at the EWL Tournament. Among his wins was a 10-2 major decision over Torsten Gillespie in the dual meet between the two. As a senior at Fort LeBoeuf High School he finished 38-4, defeating Colby Pisani of Ridgway in the 135 lb. Class AA final.

### ► Boro Crowns Three Champs to Finish Second at Reno Tournament

Edinboro had three champions and a total of eight wrestlers pace at the Reno Tournament. Edinboro ended up finishing second out of 30 teams, with Oklahoma State bringing home first place. **Gregor Gillespie** won the title at 157 lbs., with Jarrod King winning at 165 lbs. and **Chris Honeycutt** at 184 lbs. **Ricky Deubel** placed second at 133 lbs., with **Kyle Fluke** third at 125 lbs. **Pat Bradshaw** placed fourth at 197 lbs., while **Joel Webster** (141 lbs.) and **Torsten Gillespie** (149 lbs.) came in sixth.

### ► Honeycutt Honored by EWL, PSAC

**Chris Honeycutt** captured both the EWL and PSAC Wrestler of the Week honors after taking home first place at 184 lbs. in the Reno Tournament. The sophomore won all five of his matches to improve to 13-2 on the season. He

won by major decision over 19th-ranked John Barone of Duke in the semifinals, then handed tenth-ranked Joe LeBlanc of Wyoming a 4-1 defeat in the finals.

### ► Webster Also Honored by EWL, PSAC

Earlier this month **Joel Webster** won the PSAC championship at 141 lbs., his biggest collegiate wrestling accomplishment to date. That was until this past Sunday, when the junior upset defending national champion J Jagers of Ohio State, who came in ranked eighth. The match was tied at 3-3 but Jagers owned riding time. With 12 seconds left Webster posted a takedown, then held off Jagers reversal attempt at the buzzer for a 5-4 decision. The victory earned him EWL and PSAC Wrestler of the Week honors.

### ► Moricone Remains Out

Senior **Phil Moricone** opened the season with three wins in the Fighting Scot Duals, but he has not competed since due to an injury suffered in practice. He had been ranked 17th by InterMat at 174 lbs. before dropping out this week. Moricone, a two-time national qualifier, will not return until at least January.

### ► Scots Win Fourth Straight PSAC Title

Edinboro became the first team since Lock Haven in 1948 to win four straight Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championships on December 6. Edinboro became the first team in PSAC history to win four consecutive PSAC titles. Lock Haven won five crowns in a row from 1940-42 and 1947-48. The Fighting Scots finished with 173.5 points to easily outdistance the ten-team field. Bloomsburg was second with 108 points. Edinboro has now won 10 of the last 12 PSAC crowns. In addition, the Fighting Scots had seven champions for the second straight year. That ties the PSAC record, also owned by the 1986 Clarion team. **Gregor Gillespie** was named the Outstanding Wrestler for the second straight year after winning the 157 lb. championship, his third PSAC title. Gillespie was a 3-0 winner over 11th-ranked Matt Moley of Bloomsburg in the championship bout, the highest profile match of the day. **Jarrod King** and **Pat Bradshaw** won their second titles at 165 and 197 lbs., respectively. **Joel Webster** was first at 141 lbs., with **Torsten Gillespie** recording a reversal with one second remaining for a 9-8 decision in the 149 lb. title match. **Chris Honeycutt** was the winner at 184 lbs., and **Joey Fendone** picked up the crown at heavyweight.

### ► Gillespie Named Outstanding Wrestler at PSAC's

Matt King is one of ten Edinboro wrestlers to win three-or-more PSAC championships, capturing the 165 lb. title from 2002-04. His brother **Jarrod King** won't be able to join that list, but he did become a two-time titlist at the same weight when he defeated Ricky Schmelyun of Bloomsburg, 10-3, in the finals. The younger King is a senior who transferred to Edinboro a year ago from Oklahoma. That gives the King brothers five PSAC championships.

## ► ... Bradshaw's Make it Four Crowns

A year ago **Pat Bradshaw** joined his father Jeff as a father-son PSAC champion combination, with Jeff winning titles in 1977 and 1978 at 190 lbs. while competing for Edinboro. The Bradshaw's can now boast of four PSAC crowns after Pat won his second straight championship at 197 lbs., once again defeating Ben Hepburn of Lock Haven in the finals.

## ► Torsten Gillespie Waits Til Last Second for Win

While older brother Gregor Gillespie was picking up his third PSAC championship, **Torsten Gillespie** garnered his first in shocking fashion. In a back-and-forth match with Bloomsburg's George Hickman, the sophomore found himself tied at 7-7 after a Hickman takedown late in the third period. Hickman owned riding time, meaning at the very least Gillespie needed an escape to keep the match going. With one second remaining, Gillespie reversed Hickman to win the 149 lb. championship thanks to a 9-8 decision.

## ► Seven Grapplers Place at Oklahoma Gold Classic

Edinboro had seven wrestlers place at the Oklahoma Gold Classic. Leading the way were a trio of first place finishers - **Gregor Gillespie** at 157 lbs., **Jarrold King** at 165 lbs., and **Joey Fendone** at heavyweight. **Shawn Fendone**, Joey's younger brother, came in second at 184 lbs. while filling in for injured starter Chris Honeycutt. **Ricky Deubel** and **Pat Bradshaw** came in third, with **Kyle Fluke** fourth and **Torsten Gillespie** fifth.

## ► Gillespie Captures Rematch with Vallimont

A year ago **Gregor Gillespie** placed fifth at the NCAA Division I National Championships. Along the way Gillespie dropped a 2-1 decision to Dan Vallimont of Penn State, that loss coming in the consolation finals. The Edinboro senior made the most of his rematch with Vallimont at the Sprawl & Brawl Duals. Following a scoreless first period, Gillespie chose the top and ended up turning Vallimont twice, picking up five near-fall points. He added a takedown in the third period, plus riding time for an 8-0 major decision. At the time, Vallimont was ranked second at 157 lbs. and Gillespie third.

## ► Edinboro Signs Four During Early Signing Period

Edinboro signed four wrestlers for 2009-10 during the recent early signing period. The four signees are: John Greisheimer of Wantagh(NY) High School, who could compete at 149/157 lbs.; Michael Garofalo of Colonial Forge(Va.) High School, a 125-pounder; Zach Buonaiuto of Miller Place(NY) High School at 197 lbs.; and Evan Yenolevich of Northwestern Lehigh(Pa.) High School at 125/133 lbs.

**Paul Donahoe** and **Garrett Scott**. Donahoe was a two-time All-American and an NCAA champion at Nebraska, while Scott competed this past year as a freshman at Penn State. Donahoe must meet NCAA transfer requirements and will not be able to compete until at least the end of the first semester. He has one season of eligibility remaining. He captured the 125 lb. national championship in 2007, upsetting top-ranked Sam Hazewinkel in the finals. Donahoe defeated Hazewinkel, 3-1 in sudden victory to cap a 35-5 campaign. This past year Donahoe earned All-American honors for the second time with a third place finish at 125 lbs. Donahoe finished the 2007-08 campaign with a 25-4 record, winning the Big 12 Championship. He had a 26-9 record as a sophomore, going 2-2 at Nationals. He departed the Cornhuskers with a career record of 86-18. Scott is a former three-time PIAA Class AA champion while competing at Juniata Valley High School, compiling a 130-2 career record. He did not lose a match his final three seasons. A year ago he stepped into the starting lineup at Penn State at 141 lbs. when starter Jake Strayer went down with an injury. He proceeded to finish with a 21-7 record and qualify for Nationals thanks to a seventh place finish at the Big Ten Championships. He went 3-2 at Nationals. Scott will redshirt in 2008-09 and have three years of eligibility remaining.
