### Rebuilt Boro Squad Seeks Ninth Straight EWL Crown

**EDINBORO, Pa.** - This has not been the year that Edinboro head coach Tim Flynn expected, but at the end one thing is usually a given. The Eastern Wrestling League title runs through Edinboro. Last year Pittsburgh ended Edinboro's string of four straight regular season titles, and the Panthers won their second straight crown two weeks ago when they edged Edinboro 19-16.

But Flynn is hoping his charges can duplicate last year's performance at the EWL Tournament. Edinboro will still hold the key to the title. It certainly won't be easy. Flynn's lineup features five wrestlers competing in the EWL Tournament for the first time, including two true freshmen and two redshirt freshmen.

Edinboro appeared to be hitting its stride with five wins in its final seven matches. That left the Fighting Scots with a 9-10-1 dual record, including 4-2 in EWL competition. That represents the first time that Flynn has suffered a losing season since he took over as head coach in 1997-98. But a tough early-season schedule left the young lineup seasoned as the year progressed.

The Fighting Scots faced six nationally-ranked teams. They tied 23rd-ranked Purdue in the Comfort Suites Duals, then lost to 17th-ranked Virginia Tech (27-6) and 24th-ranked Virginia (25-13) at the Hershey Duals. That was followed by a 31-14 defeat to 22nd-ranked Ohio State. The Fighting Scots fell to second-ranked Penn State 37-12 in the Virginia Duals, and ended the year with the close loss to the 23rd-ranked Panthers. In addition, Edinboro came in seventh out of 34 teams at the Southern Scuffle.

When the seven EWL teams convene in Bloomsburg, PA on Sunday, March 6 for the 36th Annual Eastern Wrestling League Tournament all must still take the crown away from Edinboro. The Fighting Scots have won nine straight EWL championships, the most unlikely coming a year ago. Trailing heading into the finals, Edinboro won all ten of its matches in the last round, with four wrestlers taking home championships and six wrestlers finishing third. They made up an 18.5 point deficit to Pittsburgh and ended up finishing with 135.5 points to Pittsburgh's 121.5 points. All told Edinboro has won 12 of the last 13 EWL titles.

This year's Edinboro team is not as seasoned as last year's, however. Only two wrestlers, Torsten Gillespie a year ago at 149 lbs. and Chris Honeycutt in 2009 at 184 lbs., have won EWL championships. Three wrestlers have been to Nationals. Gillespie, who earned All-American hon-

▶ Tim Flynn has enjoyed immense success as Edinboro's head coach. The former Penn State All-American holds the career record for wins with a 154-55-5 record, picking up win No. 150 against Eastern Michigan. During his 13-year reign Edinboro has won an incredible 12 Eastern Wrestling League championships, including a current streak of eight in a row. In addition, the Fighting Scots have set the PSAC record for consecutive conference championships with five. In all, Flynn has 11 PSAC titles to his credit. He has been selected the PSAC

Coach of the Year nine times and the EWL Coach of the Year five times. Most importantly, under Flynn's guidance Edinboro has finished in the top ten at the NCAA Division I National Championships three of the last five years, and has been in the top twenty ten times. Flynn has mentored three National Champions, 26 All-Americans, 36 EWL champions and 56 PSAC champions.

ors a year ago with a sixth place finish at 149 lbs., seeks his fourth trip to Nationals. Honeycutt, the top-ranked wrestler at 184 lbs. with a perfect 24-0 record, and Eric Morrill are after their third appearance at Nationals.

Two years ago the NCAA adopted a new national qualifier allocation system which puts even more emphasis on wrestling well at the EWL Tournament. The EWL has an allotment of 20 qualifiers, up one from last year, for Nationals. Those 20 qualifiers break down as follows: 125 lbs. - 2; 133 lbs. - 2; 141 lbs. - 2; 149 lbs. - 2; 157 lbs. - 3; 165 lbs. - 2; 174 lbs. - 1; 184 lbs. - 3; 197 lbs. - 2; 285 lbs. - 1. After that there is an allocation of 48 at-large bids which will be announced on March 9 by the NCAA Division I Wrestling Committee.

The action at Bloomsburg's Nelson Field House starts at 10 a.m. with Session I. Session II starts at 5 p.m. and Session III gets underway at 7 p.m.

All told, five 2010 EWL champions are back. In addition to Gillespie,

Anthony Zanetta of Pittsburgh won the 125 lb. title, teammate Tyler Nauman has won the last two titles at 141 lbs., and Ryan Tomei, another Panther, is the reigning heavyweight champion. Lock Haven's John Trumbetti won the 133 lb. championship.

**Flynn Comments:** "I think we're a lot better than we were a month or two ago. Each kid has some things they need to work on before EWL's. When you have a small number of teams you need everyone responding."

## The Edinboro Lineup

### ▶ 125 lbs. - Bijan Banks (0-22, Fr.-r)

#### First EWL Appearance

Bijan Banks was thrown into the starting lineup when PSAC champion Evan Yenolevich, who at one point was nationally ranked, left the team. Banks made his debut in the starting lineup against Clarion, losing by fall. A redshirt freshman, Banks is 0-22 this year. He had earlier competed in the U Open, the Keystone Classic, and the Nittany Lion Open before taking over as the starter.

**The Rest of the Field (2 qualifiers):** Pittsburgh's Anthony Zanetta is the returning EWL champion at 125 lbs. A year ago he edged West Virginia's Shane Young in the finals. Zanetta has a deceiving 14-10 record, while Young comes in at 26-7. Young is ranked 24th in the NCAA coaches poll and Zanetta 25th. Bloomsburg freshman Sean Boylan (17-12) and Lock Haven's Nick Hyatt (16-9) look to push this duo. Boylan is ranked 30th in the NCAA rankings. Cleveland State's Ben Willeford (10-20) and Thomas Gowing of Clarion (3-16) round out the weight class.

**Flynn Comments:** "Bijan has been working hard. He needs to get on the board and get a W. His attitude is great. You have to just keep plugging away, especially where he's at. Hopefully his hard work will pay off."

### ▶ 133 lbs. - #16/#17 Eric Morrill (20-8, Sr.)

#### Fourth EWL Appearance

After a season with a couple of bumps due to injury Morrill has come on of late in search of his third trip to Nationals. Morrill's most recent absence came following an automobile accident, keeping him out for a month. He made his return to the Edinboro lineup in the Southern Scuffle. He had not wrestled since the Keystone Classic, where he finished fourth. He won his first three matches at the Southern Scuffle before losing to fourth-ranked Lou Ruggirello of Hofstra in the quarterfinals, then fell to teammate A.J. Schopp in his first consolation match. Morrill went 3-2 at the Virginia Duals, with both losses to nationally-ranked wrestlers. He has won 11 straight matches, including back-to-back wins over Buffalo's Kevin Smith, ranked 20th by *Amateur Wrestling News*, plus a 5-3 decision over Lock Haven's John Trumbetti, the reigning EWL champion. He ended the regular season with an impressive 6-3 decision over then 15th-ranked Nathan Pennesi of West Virginia. Morrill has climbed into the rankings the last month and is now 16th according to InterMat and 17th in the *Amateur Wrestling News* poll. He is also ranked 18th in the NCAA coaches poll. Morrill has boosted his record to 20-8, and he now has an 86-43 career ledger. He is a two-time national qualifier at 125 lbs. who moved up to 133 lbs. this season. Six of his eight losses have come to nationally-ranked grapplers, and he owns a 6-2 decision over then 16th-ranked Freddie Santiate of Boston University.

**The Rest of the Field (2 qualifiers):** The EWL features a strong field at 133 lbs. West Virginia's Nathan Pennesi is a redshirt freshman with a 23-5 record. He is ranked 18th in both the InterMat and *Amateur Wrestling News*' polls, along with 16th in the NCAA poll. Lock Haven's John Trumbetti won the 133 lbs. title a year ago when he upset defending champion Jimmy Conroy of Pittsburgh via a 2-0 decision. Trumbetti is 30th in the NCAA poll. He has a 15-7 record. Four more freshmen fill out the weight class. Nick Wilcox of Bloomsburg has an 18-13 record, while Shane Mack of Pittsburgh has a 14-14 record. Cleveland State's Nick Flannery (12-17) and Devin Cook of Clarion (7-11) round out the field.

**Flynn Comments:** "I think Eric's wrestling well. A lot of people don't realize his RPI is real high. He's lost to good kids. It has taken him awhile to recover from everything. He was sick over the summer, then he got the concussion. He's looking good now. I'm very happy where he's at."

## ►141 lbs. – Kasey Davis (18-14, Fr.)

### First EWL Appearance

Davis is another wrestler who began the year as a non-starter. The plan was to have him redshirt, but that changed just prior to the PSAC Championships when Vinny Pisani was dismissed from the team. The true freshman from nearby Meadville High School went 1-2 at the PSAC's, and has since done well as the team's starter. He owns an 18-14 record a pair of falls and five major decisions. He picked up a second place finish at the UB Open. Davis went 2-2 at the Southern Scuffle and was 2-3 at the Virginia Duals. He has an 18-12 record that includes a second place finish at the UB Open.

**The Rest of the Field (2 qualifiers):** Tyler Nauman looks for his third straight EWL crown. The Pittsburgh junior went on to earn All-American honors a year ago with a fifth place finish at Nationals. Nauman owns a 21-3 record and is ranked seventh by *Amateur Wrestling News* and eighth by *InterMat*. He is also eighth in the NCAA poll. Lock Haven's Matt Bonson, a transfer from Virginia, will push Nauman. Bonson is ranked 21st by the NCAA and has a 22-2 record. West Virginia's Michael Morales (15-10) and Derek Shingara of Bloomsburg (18-16) are freshman like Davis looking to make a name for themselves. Hunter McGraw (11-15) has taken over as the starter for Clarion, while Cleveland State has junior Josh Palivoda (6-17) in the lineup.

**Flynn Comments:** "Kasey's wrestled well. If he can consistently put out his best product he is very tough. He's wrestled well for us. He faced a highly-ranked kid against Pitt and was right there. That was a big opponent."

## ►149 lbs. – #17/#15 Torsten Gillespie (19-8, Sr.)

### Fourth EWL Appearance

Gillespie has had an up-an-down senior season. It is hoped he can follow a similar path to last year, when he turned in an outstanding showing at the EWL Tournament to win the 149 lb. crown, then continue that strong wrestling at Nationals. Gillespie ended up placing sixth to earn All-American honors for the first time. He seeks his fourth trip to Nationals, and second at 149 lbs. He enjoyed a big up at the Southern Scuffle, going 5-1 to finish third for the second straight year. Gillespie dominated in his first three matches, winning by fall, technical fall and major decision. He would lose in the quarterfinals to sixth-ranked Frank Molinaro of Penn State, but he won twice in the wrestlebacks to finish third. The first was a 13-2 major decision over 14th-ranked Ivan Lopouchanski of UNC Greensboro. In the third place match he bested Scott Sakaguchi of Oregon State 6-4. Gillespie split four matches at the Virginia Duals, losing again to Molinaro, 10-2, along with an 8-2 defeat to fourth-ranked Kevin LeValley of Bucknell. The two had previously met in the NWCA All-Star Classic, with LeValley winning 6-0. Gillespie did post a 7-2 decision over Virginia's Derek Valenti. While Gillespie did not face UB's Desi Green at the Virginia Duals, the two met in the dual match and 19th-ranked Green upset Gillespie 5-1. The ups and downs continued as he won a 12-1 major decision against Eastern Michigan, only to lose 1-0 to Owen Wilkinson of Lock Haven. Since the loss to Wilkinson he has run off four straight wins to improve to 19-8 with seven major decisions. Gillespie opened the year ranked in the top five but he has fallen to 17th according to *InterMat* and 15th in the *Amateur Wrestling News*' rankings. He is 19th in the NCAA rankings. He owns a 5-1 decision over then-19th-ranked Valenti and a 5-1 loss to Hofstra's Justin Accordino, who was 18th. He picked up his second PSAC crown at 149 lbs. In fact, Gillespie was dominant at the PSAC's, winning by technical fall and twice by major decision, including a 12-2 score over Ethan Swope of Gannon in the finals. Gillespie now has a 97-61 career ledger.

**The Rest of the Field (2 qualifiers):** Several solid if underrated wrestlers look to deny Gillespie a second EWL title. Clarion freshman Anthony White owns a 22-10 record that includes a 4-2 decision over

Gillespie. Brandon Rader of West Virginia is an extremely talented wrestler who has been decimated by injuries. The fifth-year senior has a 12-8 record and is 28th in the NCAA rankings. He began his career destined to become one of the all-time greats at WVU, earning All-American honors at 141 lbs. his first two years and winning 54 matches. Since then he has been hampered by knee and shoulder ailments. Josh Roosa of Bloomsburg was a nationally-ranked wrestler a year ago, but this year has a 10-8 record. Pittsburgh's Dave Johnson has a 16-16 record. Lawrence Cavello of Cleveland State (12-19) and Lock Haven's Owen Wilkinson (6-13) round out the weight class. Oddly enough, Wilkinson beat both Gillespie and White.

**Flynn Comments:** "Tor's wrestled well his last couple matches. He looks a little healthier. Missing a couple weeks has freshened him up. We're trying to keep him focused the entire seven minutes. He's proven he can beat the best kids."

## ►157 lbs. – Johnny Greisheimer (20-12, So.)

### Second EWL Appearance

Greisheimer, a sophomore, turned in a strong showing at last year's EWL's, coming in third. He has won five of his last seven matches and comes in with a 20-12 record. He is ranked 27th in the NCAA poll. The wins include a fall at 2:40 over Bloomsburg's Frank Hickman, a former PSAC champion. He turned in a strong showing at the Virginia Duals after disappointing outings against Clarion and in the Southern Scuffle. He ran into a buzzsaw in Clarion's James Fleming, then lost two of three matches at the Southern Scuffle. Ranked 13th at 157 lbs., Fleming handed Greisheimer a 15-0 defeat. That was a rematch of the PSAC title bout which Fleming won 10-2. Greisheimer went 4-1 at the Virginia Duals with the lone loss to then-3rd-ranked David Taylor of Penn State. Greisheimer earned a second place finish at the PSAC Championships. He upset the top seed and defending champion, Brock Parker of East Stroudsburg 2-1 before losing to Fleming, ranked 17th at the time. He also has a third place finish at the Keystone Classic to his credit. He went 5-1 there, with the lone loss to second-ranked Steve Fittery of American. In fact, seven of his losses are to nationally-ranked foes, including a 9-0 major decision to 14th-ranked Colt Sponseller of Ohio State. He suffered a narrow 4-3 loss to 16th-ranked Colton Salazar of Purdue, a three-time national qualifier, and later lost a 9-5 decision to 14th-ranked Peter Yates of Virginia Tech.

**The Rest of the Field (3 qualifiers):** Clarion's James Fleming moved up from 149 to 157 lbs. this year. A year ago he lost to Gregor Gillespie in the EWL title match. Fleming is ranked fifth according to *Amateur Wrestling News* and 13th by *InterMat*, along with tenth in the NCAA rankings. He has a 27-2 record. Bloomsburg's Frank Hickman is also ranked according to the NCAA coaches, sitting in the 23rd position. The junior has a 23-8 ledger. Pittsburgh's Donnie Tasser has a 17-15 record. West Virginia's Ryan Goodman has a 12-15 record, and Cleveland State freshman Matt Donohoe is 12-16.

**Flynn Comments:** "I think John has been wrestling well. He didn't wrestle well the last few seconds against Pittsburgh. I think he's focused and wants to get to Nationals. He's ready."

## ►165 lbs. – Ethan Saylor (6-20, Fr.)

### First EWL Appearance

When Matt Laird was dismissed for a violation of team rules, Ethan Saylor took over as the starter beginning with the PSAC Championships. After a promising start he had struggled of late, losing 13 of his last 14 matches. However, throughout the period he has been a competitive wrestler, including a 6-4 decision to Cleveland State's Robbie Michaels, with Michaels winning with a takedown with 14 seconds left. The true freshman went 1-2 at the PSAC Championships, picking up an 8-6 decision over Jesse Dunn of East Stroudsburg. He was 2-2 at the Southern Scuffle. He had a tough time at the Virginia Duals, losing all five of his matches.

**The Rest of the Field (3 qualifiers):** No fewer than four wrestlers look to have a strong shot at the title. For starters there's West Virginia's Donnie Jones, a three-time national qualifier, who lost to Edinboro's Jarrod King in the title match the last two years. The fifth-year senior has a 17-3 record and is ranked 20th by *Amateur Wrestling*

News. He is also 24th in the NCAA rankings. Pittsburgh's Ethan Headlee was a national qualifier in 2008-09. He owns a 24-10 record and is ranked 27th by the NCAA. Cleveland State senior Rob Michaels, who is 32nd in the NCAA poll, has a 20-8 record and owns a win over Headlee. Bekzod Abdurakhmonov of Clarion, a junior college All-American who is 26th in the NCAA poll, comes in at 28-8. He beat Michaels, but lost close decisions to Headlee and Jones. Throw in Bloomsburg's Josh Veltre, a sophomore with a 17-11 record, and this is a very competitive weight class. Lock Haven freshman Dylan Caprio (0-21) rounds out the field.

**Flynn Comments:** "Ethan's getting better. As a freshman he's done a fantastic job. In August or September he didn't know or figure he'd be in this position. He's had unbelievable effort. If he continues that way the future is very bright."

## ▶174 lbs. – Chris Hrunka (15-16, Jr.)

### First EWL Appearance

After filling in for Jarrod King on a couple of occasions last year, Hrunka moved up to 174 lbs. this year to replace EWL champion Phil Moricone. He was 1-9 a year ago, but he has shown marked improvement and comes in with a 15-16 record. He won three of five matches at the Virginia Duals, with the losses to second-ranked Ed Ruth of Penn State and fourth Chris Henrich of Virginia. Prior to that Hrunka had posted a big 4-2 decision over Clarion's Scott Joseph before the Southern Scuffle but then lost twice in North Carolina. Joseph had beaten Hrunka twice at the PSAC Championships. Hrunka ended up fifth at the PSAC's.

**The Rest of the Field (1 qualifier):** Don't be fooled by Alex Meade's 5-2 record. The West Virginia wrestler is a former blue-chip recruit who transferred from Oklahoma State and just recently got going for the Mountaineers. He was 29-10 last year at Oklahoma State, defeating four eventual All-Americans. Mike Dessino of Bloomsburg has a 21-8 record, and Lock Haven's Mike Khoury also has 21 wins at 21-13. Pittsburgh has used a number of wrestlers at 174 lbs., although the Panthers are hopeful Andy Vaughan (12-8) will be able to go. Aric Thurn of Cleveland State is 9-18. Clarion redshirt freshman Steven Cressley has an 11-18 record, although he spent most of the year at 184 lbs. before bumping down due to injuries.

**Flynn Comments:** "Chris is right there with the other kids in our league. He has lost a couple of close matches. He's still figuring that he can compete at this level, especially when he's offensive-minded. It's a very tight weight class. I think Chris can do well. He can do some damage."

## ▶184 lbs. – #1/#1 Chris Honeycutt (24-0, Jr.)

### Third EWL Appearance

The Edinboro lineup received a big boost with the return of Honeycutt at the PSAC Championships. The two-time national qualifier missed the first month of the season while rehabbing following summer shoulder surgery. Since that time he has gone on to win all 24 of his matches and has climbed into the top spot in the country in all three polls. He has four falls, a pair of technical falls, and eight major decisions. Honeycutt repeated as the Southern Scuffle champion, winning all six of his bouts. In the finals he bested third-ranked Steve Bosak of Cornell by a 7-2 decision. In the semifinals he won a 6-4 decision over 15th-ranked Luke Rebertus of Navy. He followed that up with five straight wins at the Virginia Duals, including a 3-2 win over then-18th-ranked Jon Fausey of Virginia. He posted a 14-3 major decision over Bloomsburg's Nate Graham, who was ranked 20th. Honeycutt won his second PSAC title with three easy wins. He picked up one win by fall and two wins by a major decision, including a 12-4 major decision over Graham in the finals. He comes off a pair of big wins in the final weekend, defeating 20th-ranked Matt Ryan of West Virginia, 5-2, then handing 19th-ranked Max Thomusseit of Pittsburgh an 11-2 loss. Honeycutt is a two-time national qualifier who fell a win short of earning All-American honors in 2009. He redshirted a year ago. He owns an 83-18 career record. Honeycutt won the 2009 EWL title and was the runnerup as a freshman.

**The Rest of the Field (3 qualifiers):** Honeycutt faces a trio of strong wrestlers who look to knock him from the ranks of the unbeaten. Pittsburgh's Max Thomusseit is a freshman who is ranked 20th by

InterMat with a 24-10 ledger. He also stands 20th in the NCAA coaches poll. Matt Ryan of West Virginia is ranked 20th in the Amateur Wrestling News poll, along with 25th in the NCAA rankings. The fourth-year junior has a 17-6 record. Bloomsburg's Nate Graham gives the EWL four wrestlers in the NCAA poll, with spots for three qualifiers. He is 22nd. The senior has a 23-7 record. He was the runnerup at 174 lbs. last year.

**Flynn Comments:** "Chris has had a great year. He's wrestled hard all year and has been focused on EWL's and Nationals. He's practicing really hard. If he continues this can be a happy year. He has the ability and the desire. He's still trying to go out and earn a national championship. Being highly-ranked means nothing. He knows that."

## ▶197 lbs. – Shawn Fendone (23-9, Sr.)

### Second EWL Appearance

Fendone had run off eleven straight wins, including winning all five of his matches at the Virginia Duals, before losing by fall to North Carolina's Zac Bennett. The stretch also included a 13-0 major decision over UB's Jimmy Hamel, a two-time national qualifier. He came back with a pair of close decisions against Pittsburgh and West Virginia to boost his record to 23-9. That includes eight falls. The winning streak helped him appear in the national rankings for the first time, as he was ranked 20th by Amateur Wrestling News before falling out. He is 24th in the NCAA rankings. Fendone picked up momentum in December after posting one of his biggest wins against Clarion. The senior pinned Clarion's Alex Thomas in 48 seconds. Fendone and Thomas have had an interesting history, with Thomas pinning Fendone in 51 seconds in the PSAC championship match. They've met five times, with four ending in falls. He followed that up with a seventh place showing at the Southern Scuffle. Fendone went 4-2, picking up a medical forfeit over 15th-ranked Anthony Biondi of Michigan in the seventh place match. Four of Fendone's losses have come to nationally-ranked opponents. He took home fourth place at the Keystone Classic.

**The Rest of the Field (2 qualifiers):** Pittsburgh's Zac Thomusseit is ranked fifth by InterMat and Amateur Wrestling News, but an injury forced him to miss all of the EWL season. The junior has a 20-3 record. He was the runnerup at 184 lbs. last year, losing to Edinboro's Pat Bradshaw. Clarion's Alex Thomas has an 18-9 record. A year ago he was the EWL runnerup. Bloomsburg redshirt freshman Richard Perry has a 12-7 record, while West Virginia's Kyle Rooney is another tough competitor despite a 9-10 ledger. Lock Haven's Derek Caldwell (5-13) and Nick Anthony of Cleveland State (4-18) round out the field.

**Flynn Comments:** "Shawn has really wrestled well the second half of the season. He's a little like John and Chris in that he needs to be offensive-minded and focused on what he does. If he shuts down or doesn't have the spark he goes from a good to average wrestler."

### James (15-14, Fr.-r)

#### First EWL Appearance

James is a former New York state champion at 215 lbs. who has posted a 16-15 record in his first season as the starter. That includes seven falls, three coming in his last four bouts. He previously went 3-2 at the Virginia Duals, followed by a big 5-2 decision over UB's Brett Correll. He had back-to-back second place finishes at the Keystone Classic and PSAC Championships, but sat out the Ohio State match with a minor injury. He returned with a solid 2-1 decision over Clarion's Quintas

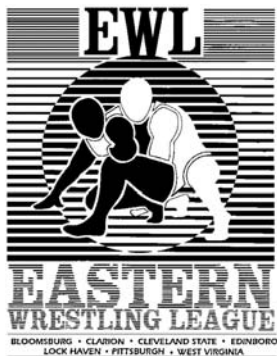

## Boro Bits

### ► Three Seniors Honored Prior to Pitt Match

Edinboro honored its three seniors in pre-match festivities before facing Pittsburgh. **Eric Morrill** (133 lbs.), **Torsten Gillespie** (149 lbs.) and **Shawn Fendone** (197 lbs.) are all key components of this year's lineup. Gillespie has registered 97 career wins and is a three-time national qualifier. He earned All-American honors last year with a sixth place finish at 149 lbs. He currently has a 19-8 record. Morrill is in search of his third trip to Nationals. He moved up to 133 lbs. this year and has a 20-8 record, giving him 86 career wins. Fendone is enjoying his finest season in his second year as a starter. He has a 23-9 record and cracked into the national rankings several weeks ago.

### ► Jarrod King Receives Academic Awards

A year ago **Jarrod King** concluded a brilliant career as a two-time All-American at 165 lbs. He returned on Saturday for the Pitt match to be honored for his academic prowess, along with his wrestling skills. King was the recipient of the Pete Nevins PSAC Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award, the first male winner at Edinboro and just the second Boro student-athlete to win the award. In addition, King earned second team CoSIDA University Division Academic All-America accolades last summer. It marked the second time he was recognized by CoSIDA.

### ► Six Place at Edinboro Open

A total of six wrestlers placed at the Edinboro Open. Leading the way were **Kory Mines** and **A.J. Schopp**, who won at 125 and 133 lbs., respectively. In fact, Schopp was named the EWL Wrestler of the Week after winning all four of his matches against solid competition. **Kenny Massey** (197) and **Mike Horton** (hwt.) placed second, while **David Habat** took third at 149 lbs. and **Mitchell Port** fourth at 141 lbs.

### ► Fendone Nationally-Ranked for First Time

A run of 11 straight wins not only left **Shawn Fendone** with a 21-8 record, but had the senior in the national rankings for the first time. Fendone was ranked 20th in the *Amateur Wrestling News* rankings recently, and he then moved up a spot to 19th. Fendone fell out of the rankings after a loss to North Carolina.

### ► Five Fighting Scots in First NCAA Coaches Rankings

The second NCAA Division I Wrestling Coaches Panel Rankings came out last week, with five Fighting Scots showing up in the rankings. The rankings are what the NCAA ultimately uses to decide who will compete at the NCAA Division I

National Championships in Philadelphia in March.

### ► Yenolevich No Longer a Fighting Scot

After going 5-3 and winning the PSAC championship at 125 lbs., **Evan Yenolevich** is no longer a member of the Fighting Scots, head coach **Tim Flynn** announced. The redshirt freshman was struggling with his weight and had not wrestled since the PSAC Championships. He recently left the team.

### ► Boro Finishes Seventh at Virginia Duals

Edinboro went 3-2 at the Virginia Duals to take home seventh place. The Fighting Scots, seeded eighth, opened with a 22-12 defeat of Old Dominion before losing to second-ranked Penn State 37-12. The Boro handed Bucknell a 26-12 defeat before falling to Virginia 21-15. In the seventh place match the Fighting Scots won the final four matches to rally for a 24-21 win over Buffalo. A pair of Scots went 5-0 for the weekend, as **Chris Honeycutt** and **Shawn Fendone** were undefeated at 184 and 197 lbs., respectively. **Johnny Greisheimer** was 4-1 at 157 lbs.

### ► Honeycutt Repeats as Southern Scuffle Champ; Boro Finishes Seventh

Three Fighting Scots placed at the Southern Scuffle, led by **Chris Honeycutt** capturing his second straight title at 184 lbs. Honeycutt, ranked second at the time, won a 7-2 decision over Cornell's third-ranked **Steve Bosak** in the title bout. **Torsten Gillespie** took home third place at 149 lbs. for the second consecutive year, and **Shawn Fendone** was seventh at 197 lbs. In addition, freshman **A.J. Schopp**, who is redshirting and wrestled unattached, took fifth place at 133 lbs. The three official placemen helped Edinboro finish seventh out of 34 teams.

### ► Honeycutt Named EWL, PSAC Wrestler of the Week

**Chris Honeycutt** was named the EWL and PSAC Wrestler of the Week after winning his second straight title at the Southern Scuffle. Competing

at 184 lbs., **Honeycutt** defeated third-ranked **Steve Bosak** of Cornell, who came in with an 18-0 record, in the finals thanks to a 7-2 decision. In the semifinals he won a 6-4 decision over **Luke Rebertus** of Navy, who was ranked 15th.

The junior picked up his second title at 184 lbs. with three straight wins. He is a two-time national qualifier who fell one win shy of earning All-American status in 2009. While redshirting last year he went 26-1 at open tournaments, including a first place finish at the Southern Scuffle.

## ► Trio Places at Cleveland State Open

Three Edinboro wrestlers, all freshmen redshirting this year, placed at the recent Cleveland State Open. **A.J. Schopp** was a perfect 5-0 and won the title at 133 lbs. He won twice by major decision, once by fall and once by technical fall. **Kory Mines** took home third place at 125 lbs., going 6-1. **David Habat** wrestled a grueling nine matches, going 7-2, to finish fifth at 149 lbs.

## ► Port Brings Home Title at Nittany Lion Open

Freshman **Mitchell Port**, who is redshirting this season, continued his impressive wrestling at the Nittany Lion Open. Competing at 133 lbs., Port won all five of his matches. He defeated Buffalo's Kevin Smith 6-2 in the finals. In the semifinals he defeated teammate **A.J. Schopp** 7-5. Schopp, also a redshirt freshman, went on to place fourth, dropping a 6-5 decision to North Carolina's Brock Livorio in the third place match.

## ► Flynn Announces Signing of Avery, Ryan

Edinboro head coach Tim Flynn has announced the signing of a pair of recruits to national let-

ters in intent. Kyle Ryan hails from national power St. Paris Graham (Oh.) High School, while Vic Avery continues the trend of New England wrestlers to continue at Edinboro. Avery is from Foxboro (Mass.) High School. Ryan will continue at 174 lbs. next year, with Avery projected at 184 lbs. Ryan is a two-time Ohio state finalist who won the 160 lb. Division II championship as a sophomore, then finished second a year ago. He heads into his senior year with a 94-20 record, including 32-5 as a junior and 45-9 as a sophomore. He was also an NHSCA freshman national champion in 2008. He placed fourth at the prestigious Ironman Tournament last year. Avery placed fifth at 135 lbs. in 2009 and second at 160 lbs. at the 2010 Massachusetts Division 3 state championships. He owns a 100-19 career record, finishing 40-4 as a junior and 40-5 as a sophomore. A year ago he also placed second at the New England Championships and was eighth at the NHSCA Junior Nationals.

## ► Seven Scots Place at Keystone Classic

All three are freshmen.

## ► Gillespie Returns as All-American

Senior **Torsten Gillespie** is the lone returning All-American for the Fighting Scots. The younger brother of four-time All-American **Gregor Gillespie**, he went into Nationals unseeded but enjoyed a big upset over Wisconsin's Kyle

## Three Crowned Champions but Boro Streak Ends at PSAC's December 4, 2010 at Bloomsburg, PA

Edinboro saw its record streak of five straight Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championships come to an end at Bloomsburg's Nelson Field House. However, it was a valiant showing by a team that had three starters missing and fielded a lineup with five freshmen. Edinboro would come in third, marking its lowest finish since the Scots finished third in 1996. Clarion bested the ten-team field with 135.5 points and three champions. Bloomsburg just edged Edinboro, finishing with 110.5 points and three champions. Edinboro finished with three champions and 109 points. A total of six Fighting Scots placed. 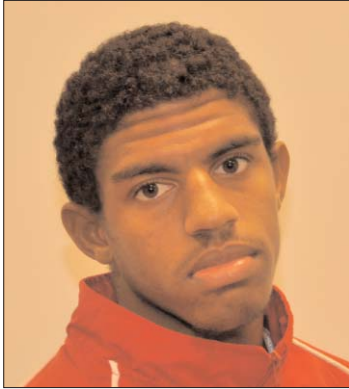

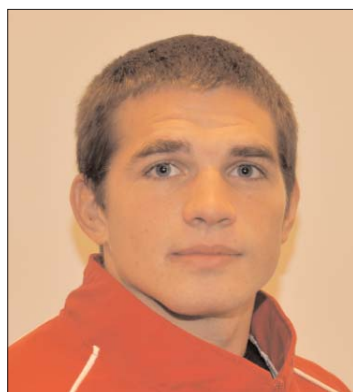
